111th Anniversary of Wright Seaplane Flight in Moraine

May 3rd will mark the 111th anniversary of the first public demonstration of the Wright Brothers Model CH Hydro-Aeroplane (or seaplane) along the Miami River in Moraine. The seaplane flown in 1913 by Orville Wright and the Wright Airplane Company's mechanic, William Jacobs, was one of over 100 test flights made along the bend of the river between Moraine and West Carrollton. The Dayton Daily News reported that "Orville made the test flight with the grace and precision that marked the flight of birds, the famous aerialist skimmed over the surface of the water rising majestically to dizzying heights at will."

The plane was towed from Dayton to Miami Shores where it was assembled, taxied out on the river and would take off north-south or east-west depending on the prevailing wind.

The CH Hydro-Aeroplane was a standard Wright Model C plane that had been fitted with the twin fourstep floats under the landing skids. You can see the development of the cockpit between 1913 and 1914.


The riverbank area in Miami Shores near the southeast end of the Moraine Airpark runway property is the location of the Wright Seaplane Base, one of the world's first seaplane bases. The local Wright Seaplane Base, Inc. club, whose mission it is to preserve the nearly forgotten history of the Wright hydro-aeroplanes through education and exhibits, will have a photo exhibit of Wright seaplanes flying along the Miami River in Moraine.

The display will be at the Payne Recreation Center April 1-6, at the Gerhardt Civic Center from April 8-13 and at the Moraine Airpark from April 15-21. For more historical information visit the Wright Seaplane Base, Inc. website at www.wrightseaplanebase.org.













Residential Large Trash Pick-Up

Each year, the City provides free large trash pick-up for residents. Residents may place their large items near the curb for removal. This pick-up takes place in May and are scheduled according to where you live. This service is not provided to businesses in the City.

Items Not Accepted:

55 gallon drums, household garbage, asbestos material, swimming pool chemicals, pesticides, herbicides, fertilizers, photographic chemicals, tanks – propane, fuel, oil, gas or oxygen tanks, compressed cylinders.

Acceptable Items and Guidelines:

Tree trimmings and/or brush must be no longer than 4 feet in length. We ask that residents stack all brush at the curb parallel with the street so that it may be easily loaded. Please keep all brush separate from all other disposal items.

Paint (25 gallons max), batteries, motor oil, metals and appliances not containing Freon will be accepted for the annual bulk trash collection. Please keep all these disposal items separate from one another.

Tires should also be kept from all other disposal items. Only a total of eight truck and car tires will be accepted for disposal. Tractor tires will not be accepted.

If you are not able to dispose of all your unwanted items on the dates mentioned above, you can arrange for a special bulk pick up by calling 937-333-4800. This service is free of charge for all Moraine residents.

Your cooperation is greatly appreciated during Moraine's annual bulk trash collection.

Every year, it is the duty of the citizens to make decisions on laws, taxes, and the officials that will make or enforce them. Before you can vote, you have to make sure you are registered to do so.

Voter Registration

Before you are able to vote, you must be registered. For your convenience, Montgomery County offers multiple methods for you to register to vote. As a reminder, you must be registered to vote thirty days before the day of the election.

Ways to Vote

To ensure that every citizen has the opportunity to cast their ballot, the state of Ohio offers multiple ways to vote such as mail-in, early voting, election day, special case voting, uniformed and overseas citizens.

Identification Requirements

Identification must be presented to vote. Ohio law requires that every voter, upon appearing at the polling place to vote on Election Day, must announce his or her full name and current address and provide proof of identity.

Community Development operates as a one-stop shop with permits, planning, engineering, and economic development services.

As the weather improves and residents are eager to work on outdoor projects, please check with Community Development prior to starting. As we encourage residents to improve their property, some work may require permits. Community Development is available for any assistance on obtaining permits.

- Are you building a fence? This would require a zoning permit.
- Adding a garage? This would require a building permit.
- Constructing a new sign for your business? There is even a sign permit.
- Wanting to contract a project out? A registered contractor/subcontractor with the City of Moraine must be on file.

Severe Weather!

This preparedness guide explains weather hazards and suggests life-saving actions you can take. With this information, you can develop a plan, and be ready to act when threatening weather approaches. Remember, your safety is up to you!

What you can do before severe weather strikes.

- Develop a plan for you and your family at home, and when outdoors.
- Identify a safe place to take shelter.
- Have frequent drills.
- Have a NOAA weather radio with warning alarm tone and battery back-up to receive warnings.
- Listen to the radio and television for weather information.

Tornadoes

Although tornadoes occur in many parts of the world, they are found most frequently in the United States. In an average year, 1,200 tornadoes cause 70 fatalities and 1,500 injuries nationwide.


Tornado safety rules


- In a home or building, move to a pre-designated shelter, such as a basement.
- If an underground shelter is not available, move to a small interior room or hallway on the lowest floor and get under a sturdy piece of furniture.
- Stay away from windows.
- Get out of automobiles. Do not try to outrun a tornado in your car.
- If caught outside or in a vehicle, lie flat in a nearby ditch or depression and cover your head with your hands.
- Be aware of flying debris. Flying debris from tornadoes causes most fatalities and injuries.
- Mobile homes, even if tied down, offer little protection from tornadoes. Leave and get to the nearest sturdy building.

Flash floods

Flash floods are the #1 cause of deaths associated with thunderstorms with more than 140 fatalities each year. Most flash floods fatalities occur at night and most victims are people who become trapped in automobiles. Six inches of fast-moving water can knock you off your feet; a depth of two feet will cause most vehicles to float.

- Avoid walking, swimming, or driving in floodwaters.
- Stay away from high water, storm drains, ditches, ravines, or culverts.
- If you come up on floodwaters, stop, turn around, and go another way.
- Don't let children play near storm drains.





Moraine's Tornado Siren Testing

The Fire Division tests the tornado sirens on the first Monday of each month at noon, weather permitting. These test are to ensure the sirens are operating properly.


The sirens are not designed to be heard "Citywide" while indoors. The sirens are primarily to warn people who are outdoors, away from television and radios.

Storm Water Management

Anything that enters a storm sewer system is discharged untreated into the water bodies we use for swimming, fishing and providing drinking water. Polluted storm water runoff is a threat to clean water.

Roofs, parking lots, streets and lawns prevent storm water from soaking into the ground. As storm water flows over these areas, it can dissolve, pick up and transport things such as automotive waste, lawn chemicals, paints and eroded soil. When these pollutants make their way into streams and rivers, they can destroy fish, wildlife and aquatic life habitats. This



contamination can lessen aesthetic value and threaten public health.

What To Do

- Keep chemicals, yard waste and other material out of storm drains.
- Choose plants that are native to the area which don't require a lot of water and are resistant to insects and disease.
- Use a rain barrel or plant a rain garden.
- Control soil erosion plant ground cover and stabilize erosion-prone areas.
- Control insects naturally Provide habitat for birds, bats and toads and introduce praying mantises, lacewings, ladybugs and other pest-eaters to your garden.
- Use a commercial car wash or wash your car on a grassy area so the ground can filter the water.
- Check your car and other machinery for leaks and spills. Make repairs as soon as possible.

What <u>Not</u> To Do

- Over water use trickle irrigation or soaker hoses instead of sprinklers.
- Over apply follow pesticide and fertilizer directions carefully for the best results.
- Over buy only purchase what you need and follow the directions for proper storage and disposal.
- Never allow roof gutters to drain directly to the street or storm sewer.
- Mow too low set the mower blades to cut the grass two or three inches high. Mow often and leave the clippings to retain moisture and provide nutrients to the soil.
- Never put used oil and other fluids down the storm drain. Recycle oil and fluids at a service or recycling center.
- Never rinse oil or chemical spills into the storm drain. Clean up spilled fluids with an absorbent material like kitty litter or sand.

Garden Plots

Do you love to garden, but don't have the space at home to do so? The City has 79 garden plots located on Vance Road at the end of Dorf Drive (near the entrance to German Village). Each garden plot is 20' x 90,' and very affordable to reserve for the season. Registration for the garden plots takes place at the Payne Recreation Center, and is broken down into two phases:

Phase I: Opens March 1, 2024, and is for all 2023 plot users who cleared their garden plot at the conclusion of the growing year with no issues.

Phase II: Opens March 15, 2024, and is for all new gardeners.

We only guarantee the same garden plots that were used in 2023 in Phase I, not any new garden plots. For example, if you had garden plots 1 and 2, then you may reserve those same garden plots during Phase I only. If you wish to change the garden plot(s), you have to wait until Phase II to do so.

Garden plots cost \$15 for Moraine residents and \$20 for non-residents, annually. You must pay the fee at the point of registration to confirm your garden plot selection. You must plant your garden plot by May 31, 2024, or it will be reclaimed by the City. It is important to control weeds during the Summer and Fall seasons, otherwise you jeopardize losing your garden plot if weeds are overgrown.







All garden plots must be cleared by October 31, 2024 at the latest. Any gardener who does not clear their garden plot of stakes and any others items that could damage a tractor during plowing, will lose their gardening privileges for the 2025 season. Garden plots will be available for use starting early April, weather dependent. If you have any questions or need more information regarding our garden plots, please call 937-535-1060.

2023 City Income Tax Return is Due April 15, 2024

The due date to file your 2023 City Income Tax return is April 15, 2024. All residents who live in the City for the entire year or partial year are required to file a City Income Tax Return with the tax office on an annual basis, whether or not tax is due. If you are retired or do not have taxable income, you may file a



Declaration of Exemption Return for the year or may qualify to file a permanent exemption. If you file your return after the due date, you must attach a copy of your Federal Extension with your City Income Tax Return. The Federal Extension form is only extending your filing deadline and not for payment of tax due. Penalties and interest will be charged for unpaid tax balances. There is a late filing penalty of \$25, late pay penalty (15%) and late pay interest (10%) for late/unfiled tax returns.

As a convenience, we accept MasterCard and Visa for payments at the Finance Department's front desk and over the phone. Walk-in office hours will be available for filing assistance Monday-Friday from 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. If you can't make it during business hours, we have a drop box located in the lobby where you can leave copies of your documents to file in a sealed envelope (please don't leave original documents if you need them for your records.) We also have a new online filing system that you can use if you have filed with us previously at <u>www.mitstaxonline.com/moraine</u>. Please be sure to include all required documents such as: W-2s, W-2G, Schedule C/E, 1099-MISC, 1099-NEC, your Federal 1040, etc.
