## Is Your Home Playground a Safe Place to Play?

U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission

Each year, more than 200,000 children go to U.S. hospital emergency rooms with injuries associated with playground equipment.

Most injuries occur when a child falls from the equipment onto the ground. Many backyard play sets are placed on dirt or grass surfaces that do not adequately protect children when they fall.

Home Playground Safety Checklist:

1. Install and maintain a shock-absorbing surface around the play equipment. Use at least 9 inches of wood chips, mulch, or shredded rubber for play equipment up to 7 feet high. If sand or pea gravel is used, install at least a 9 inch layer for play equipment up to 5 feet high. Or, use surfacing mats made of safety-tested rubber or rubber like materials.
2. Install protective surfacing at least 6 feet in all directions from the playground equipment. For swings, be sure surfacing extends, in back and front, twice the height of the suspending bar.
3. Never attach or allow children to attach ropes, jump ropes, clothes lines, or pet leashes to play equipment - children can strangle on these.
4. Check for hardware, such as "S" hooks or protruding bolt ends, which can be hazardous.
5. Check for spaces that could trap children, such as openings in guardrails or between ladder rungs. These spaces should measure less than 3.5 inches or more than 9 inches.
6. Make sure platforms and ramps have guard rails to prevent falls.
7. Check for sharp points or edges in equipment.
8. Remove tripping hazards, such as exposed concrete footings, tree stumps, and rocks.
9. Regularly check play equipment and surfacing to make sure both are in good condition.
10. Carefully supervise children on play equipment to make sure they are safe.

## Don't be an Easy Target

Thieves want what you have and they often times target your vehicle. There are some easy ways you can help keep your vehicle and valuables safe.

- Use common sense when parking and exiting your vehicle.
- Park in a well-lit area if possible.
- Take your keys with you. Do not leave them in the vehicle and do not leave your vehicle running unattended if someone could drive off in it.
- Close and lock all doors and windows.
- Never leave valuables, including important documents, in your vehicle. If you have no choice, make sure the valuables cannot be seen from outside the vehicle.
- Most thieves will move on quickly if you follow those simple rules.

# The Great Algonquin Club Raid

On August 24, 1934, the grand opening of the new Algonquin Club in Miami Shores took place with Don Burt and his orchestra performing, delicious sandwiches and beer available and, as the Dayton Herald newspaper described, "the club will provide an unusually attractive place for those who like dining and dancing."

However, Moraine senior citizens still talk about the day fourteen years later when the club was raided for illegal gambling. On March 6, 1948, at 4:25 p.m., Sheriff's deputies simultaneously raided the Algonquin Club on Sellars Road, and the Moraine Smokery at 2652 Edison Avenue (named now Blanchard Avenue). Both facilities operated illegal betting operations violating the state racehorse law.

With 125 autos parked in the back or side of the club, a Sheriff's car occupied by two uniformed officers pulled in. A parking lot attendant, who doubled as a lookout, spotted the Sheriff's car and quickly went into the club for a minute then returned. Two plain clothes deputies walked up and rang the club's doorbell trying to get in.

The lookout, not knowing they were deputies, told the two men they couldn't get in right now with the Sheriff's car out front. The two plain clothes deputies broke the doors down and entered, finding about 300 men and women making a book on racing. Deputies confiscated racing forms, betting slips and evidence against the owners. Herbert Rumberger, operator of the club, was arrested.

Over at Moraine Smokery, located across the street from Frigidaire plant No. 2, deputies found nearly 100 people inside gambling on horses. One man and wife, who seemed to be "in" on the news of the coming raid, decided to stay because she had never seen a raid before. Tim Sizer, operator of the Moraine Smokery handbook was caught by deputies stuffing handfuls of money into a canvas sack.

Deputies did not find one display of cigars, tobacco, or cigarettes in the Smokery, but did find popcorn and soft drink vending machines, beer, pool table, loudspeakers, and blackboards listing the horse race tracks and betting instructions.

## Fireworks Safety Tips

- ★ Never allow children to play with or ignite fireworks, including sparklers.
- ★ Make sure fireworks are legal in your area before buying or using them.
- ★ Keep a bucket of water or a garden hose handy in case of fire or other mishap.
- ★ Light fireworks one at a time, then move back quickly.
- ★ Never try to re-light or pick up fireworks that have not ignited fully.
- ★ Never use fireworks while impaired by alcohol or drugs.

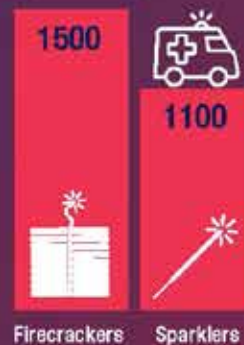

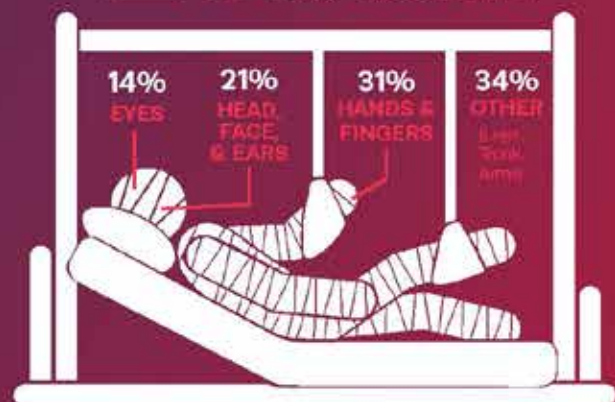

# Police Division

The City of Moraine Police Division was created by City Council in 1956, and originally consisted of 3 officers. Today the Police Division has a staff of approximately 40 employees. Along with normal functions, the Police Division utilizes bicycle and foot patrols and aggressive OVI and traffic enforcement units.

Our Police Division is also proud to participate in several highly successful regional task force operations, including the Ohio Organized Crime Task Force, the FBI Joint Terrorism Task Force, the Tactical Crime Suppression Unit and the TCSU regional SWAT team.

## Patrol Section

The Patrol Section is responsible for handling calls placed to the communications center, traffic enforcement, criminal apprehensions, and other ancillary services.

## Special Assignments Section

Our Special Assignments Section is responsible for the successful conclusion of all criminal prosecutions, crime prevention activities, undercover operations, and investigation of crimes.

## Vacation/Security Check Program

The Moraine Police Division offers a Vacation/Security Check Program for residents who will be away from home. If any problems are found, you will be contacted. We will try to assist taking care of any problems while you are away.

## Traffic School Program

The Traffic School Program was created to allow eligible violators to plead guilty to a traffic ticket and attend a distracted driving safety class. Successful graduates have the traffic ticket dismissed, no fine to pay, no points on their driver's license and no raise in insurance premiums.

## Records Section

Our Records Section is responsible for processing and organizing all records generated by the Police Division including miscellaneous reports, criminal reports, evidentiary photos and traffic accident reports.

## Self Defense Classes

The program consists of several weeks of self-defense training including personal protection techniques and general crime prevention methods. The classes are held one day a week for several weeks. The program ends with students participating in preventing a simulated attack.

### Waste Collection Information and Guidelines:

1. Please have your bulk waste items, waste container, or recycle container out by 6:30 a.m. on your collection day.  
**Remember, you have a collection day, not a collection time.**
2. Please keep bulk, metal and tires separated.  
 (They are picked up by separate trucks.)
3. Please **DO NOT** place any hot items into the waste or recycling containers (i.e., ashes from fireplaces).
4. Please wrap, bag, and containerize all trash.  
**DO NOT** put loose waste out for collection.

■ Moraine recyclables will be collected on the same day as the trash. Please **DO NOT put recyclables in plastic bags.**

■ **Please make sure your containers are clearly labeled WASTE and/or RECYCLING so they can be identified by our crews.**

■ All bulk waste collections must be scheduled in advance and will be collected every other week. Please call no later than the Wednesday before your normal collection day to schedule.

### As a reminder

■ All garbage and residential waste for collection shall be placed in a container.

### BULK WASTE DISPOSAL INFORMATION AND GUIDELINES-

**Call (937) 333-4800, no later than the Wednesday before your normal collection day, to schedule a bulk waste collection.**

■ Bulk waste items are to be set out after 3:00 p.m. of the day before the scheduled pick-up. City crews begin pick-ups at 6:30 a.m.

■ You must separate your metal items (stoves refrigerators, etc.) and tires from other bulk items. Remember to remove refrigerator doors.

■ All loose and small items must be securely contained, bundled or bagged for easy pickup.

■ We do not pick up sheet rock (drywall), concrete, rocks, brick blocks, sand, gravel, paint, construction materials or hazardous waste.

■ Yard waste (brush, hedges, tree limbs, etc.) must be tied to diameter and must be less than 25 pounds.

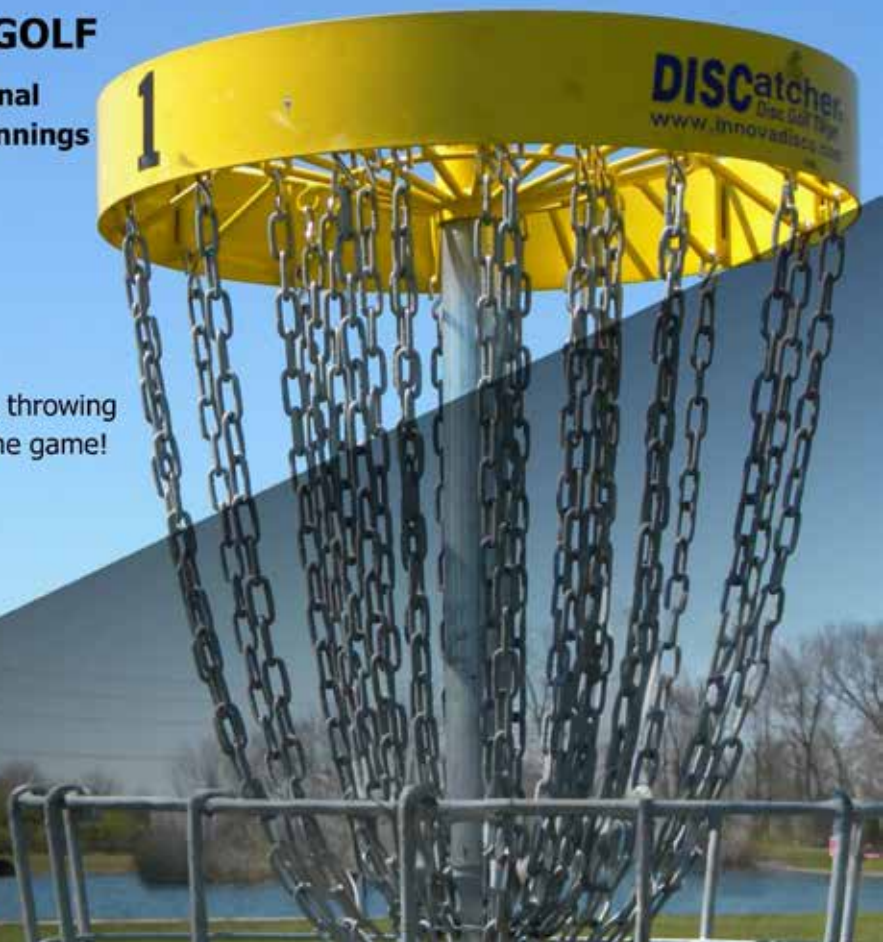
